

# Horse Sale FAQ

- **How can I pay for my horse?**
  - Cash or check. If you are paying with a check we will need a letter of credit from your bank.
- **When will I get papers for the horse I bought?**
  - Approximately 3-4 weeks after the sale.
- **When will I get my check for the horse I sold?**
  - After the 72 hour soundness guarantee is over.
- **How are lot numbers assigned?**
  - These are lottery drawn. If you have several horses consigned they will be spread throughout the sale day.
- **Is it advantageous to consign early?**
  - Absolutely! The earlier you consign the more advertising we can do for your horse.
- **What do I need to send in with consignment form?**
  - Copy of papers, check for consignment fee.
- **Can I send a picture? How?**
  - Yes. Either by email or mail a hard copy with your consignment contract
- **How can I show a video? Post a video?**
  - You can bring a dvd, flash-drive, or camera to show while your horse sells. We use a computer to show these. If you are bringing a camera please make sure you have all the necessary cords.
  - You may post a video prior to the sale on our Facebook page on the 'Spring Spectacular Catalog Horse Sale' event page. Be sure to include the name of the horse and lot number.
- **Closing date for consignment?**
  - March 1 or first 300
- **Where do I get my coggins?**
  - If you're from out of state you will need to have this before coming to the sale. If you're from in-state we will have a vet on sight that can draw blood for coggins.
- **How do I get a pen for my horse?**
  - No reservations, it is first come, first serve.
- **Should I attend preview?**
  - Yes, especially if you have a rope horse! It starts at 1pm Friday and 7:30am Saturday. This is very well attended by potential buyers. You can show your horse in many different disciplines.
- **Are selling results posted? Where?**
  - The top 20 selling horses will be posted on our website. Each individual horse will not be posted.
- **How many will we sell an hour?**
  - We will sell approximately 20-25 horses an hour.
- **When do I need to check in and what do I need to bring?**
  - If at all possible it is best to check in before the preview so you can get your hip tag number. If time is an issue we can get you the tag but will need to have horse papers, transfers, coggins etc... turned in before the horse(s) sell on Saturday.
- **How do I bid online?**
  - Create a profile at [cattleusa.com](http://cattleusa.com), then find Farmers & Ranchers on the list. Hit submit. You will be asked for banking information. Please complete this BEFORE the day of the sale. Then we will have to approve you before you are able to bid. After you have registered, it is a good idea to call us to check if you have been approved.
